

As we look back on the past year, I am filled with gratitude for the enthusiasm of our WorldChicago team, board and volunteers. I would also like to extend my deepest appreciation to all of our donors. Your generosity is instrumental in sustaining our programs and initiatives.

2023 was characterized by an exceptional level of exchange programming activity. This summer, we placed a special emphasis on youth.

New programs allowed us to welcome 21 young women from Cambodia, Fiji, Indonesia, Mongolia, Taiwan and Vietnam through the TechGirls program. This program was designed to empower and support young women (ages 15-17) from around the world, including the US, to pursue higher education and careers in STEM fields through hands-on skills development training with US technologists. For many volunteers, including myself, these experiences are priceless.

Peggy Parfenoff's tenure as President concluded this year. As we say goodbye, we acknowledge the invaluable contribution of her enduring dedication to advancing citizen diplomacy, which will be greatly missed.

Looking ahead, I am inspired by new opportunities on the horizon with Jennifer Dixon as our Executive Director. I invite each of you to join us on this journey as we strive to foster mutual understanding through global dialogue and innovation, one handshake at a time.

In partnership with the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Education and Cultural Affairs, WorldChicago facilitates a variety of international exchanges, allowing people from all over the world to experience the culture and diversity of Chicago. Through these programs, delegations learn more about the people and history of the city and celebrate what bonds us together - even from across the world.

WorldChicago hosts professional exchanges throughout the year, most notably in conjunction with the Fulbright Program and the International Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP). Both of these programs

The Fulbright Visiting Scholar Program is a flagship international educational exchange program sponsored by the U.S. government. This program provides a plethora of opportunities to international educators and researchers to study in the U.S. as well as participate in seminars and lectures to further their studies.

IVLP is the U.S. Department of State's premier professional exchange program. Through short-term visits to the U.S., IVLP encourages the building of cultural bridges between the U.S. and the world community, celebrating mutual understanding and the formation of long-lasting relationships.







International Visitor Leadership Program

U.S. Department of State

More than half of all WorldChicago's yearly visitors come to Chicago through International Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP). IVLP participants, nominated by U.S. Embassies, and visit multiple cities across the U.S. to build relationships and exchange best practices with their American counterparts in a variety of fields. WorldChicago connects IVLP visitors with non-profit, business, and civic leaders in the Chicago area to spark meaningful dialogue and collaboration.

In 2023, WorldChicago managed 49 IVLP projects that brought 469 visitors from 110 countries to Chicago for short term, professional exchange experiences. Most visitors spent 4-5 days total in Chicago, with 2-3 meetings each programming day, as well as cultural activities and home hospitality.



To best support these delegations, WorldChicago partnered with over 200 Chicagoans representing 89 organizations, universities, local and state government officials, businesses, and individual entrepreneurs proud to meet with IVLP visitors.

#### PROFESSIONAL EXCHANGES

#### **OPEN WORLD**

In March 2023, WorldChicago hosted 8 participants through the Congressional Office of International Leadership's Open World Program. As this Program focused on Regional Museum Management for the Balkans and the opening of the First Kings of Europe Exhibition at the Field Museum, participants were selected based on their home museum institution's involvement in the First Kings of Europe exhibit.

This delegation was the first within the Open World Program to bring participants from multiple countries together for an exchange. Crafted around the exhibition's opening, participants witnessed the culmination of 11 countries and 26 museums coming together to tell a story and learn about modern technology in museums and museum management.







#### SILEC INITIATIVES

WorldChicago was proud to partner with Silec Initiatives, one of the most active Nigerian NGOs fighting against youth drug abuse. During their Chicago program, participants shared best practices and met with Chicago organizations that work towards youth leadership development and combatting drug abuse.

#### MEET AMERICA POLAND

Meet America is an international exchange program designed to develop new skills, knowledge, and connections while also helping to expand participants' understanding of the United States and American culture. This year, 12 professors and MBA students from Poland came to Chicago to discuss Artificial Intelligence and the Future of Work, meeting with leaders in academia and business during their stay.

#### U.S. EMBASSY SEOUL: DIGITAL CREATORS PROGRAM







In September 2023, WorldChicago welcomed 12 participants from the Republic of Korea for a Digital Content Creators Program sponsored by the U.S. Embassy in Seoul. During this program, influencers from Korea traveled to San Diego, California; Chicago, IL; and Washington, D.C. to learn about U.S. digital creators, civil society organizations, civic activists, social media companies and experts, journalists, community members, and others using their voices to promote American values, address current social issues, and advocate for positive change. The group visited Google's headquarters in L.A., learned about Chicago's history through urban historians Dilla and Tonika Lewis Johnson, attended VidCon in Baltimore, and so much more. Through their social media accounts, millions of viewers watched the participants' experiences through their collaborative social media posts.

# 2023 FULBRIGHT VISITING SCHOLAR ENRICHMENT SEMINAR ON PUBLIC HEALTH





In April 2023, WorldChicago hosted the Fulbright Visiting Scholar Seminar on Public Health in partnership with the Institute of International Education. During this seminar, over 95 Visiting Scholars traveled to Chicago and represented their home countries. The seminar in Chicago showcased to these educators and researchers how social justice impacts public health and how the effects are often experienced unequally by different populations across the globe and local communities. The seminar displayed how Chicago prioritizes health equity through a collaborative effort to detect social determinants of health and observe data and surveillance as an approach for innovations in public health. The seminar also showcased sub-themes of mental health, community health, violence interrupters, and domestic violence prevention.



The Professional Fellows Progam is a two-way exchange program, sponsored by the U.S. Department of State. Designed to build partnerships between emerging leaders from foreign countries and the United States, participants are placed in four-week fellowships in nonprofit organizations and government offices across Chicago.

Representatives from Chicago host organizations later travel overseas to implement a joint project with their Fellows. Through this reciprocal exchange, young professionals gain practical experience and exposure to best practices in the U.S. while providing assistance and consultation at their host organizations.








#### PROFELLOWS PROGRAM: CATALYZE ALUMNI

Catalyze is an alumni network of 150+ emerging leaders, entrepreneurs, leaders in innovation, social enterprise pioneers, and university professionals from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Macedonia, and Slovenia who were a part of the Tech Innovation and Entrepreneurship Professional Fellows Program in Chicago. The Tech Innovation and Entrepreneurship Professional Fellows Program (PFP) is a program of the U.S. Department of State with funding provided by the U.S. Government, administered by WorldChicago.

# YOUNG TRANSATLANTIC INNOVATION LEADERS INITIATIVE

The Young Transatlantic Innovation Leaders Initiative (YTILI) is the U.S. Department of State's flagship program for emerging entrepreneurs from Europe.

The YTILI Fellowship Program engages young European entrepreneurs, ages 25-35, in a series of professional development and leadership activities that are designed to strengthen the transatlantic relationship and encourage European businesses, governments, and civil society to develop their innovation ecosystems. The program includes an online and in- person entrepreneurship curriculum; a fellowship placement with a business or organization in one of nine U.S. cities; opening and closing conferences in Chicago and Washington, D.C.; and a regional Innovation Summit in Ljubljana, Slovenia.







In April 2023, WorldChicago welcomed a group of 60 Fellows representing 36 different European countries for the Young Transatlantic Innovation Leaders Initiative fellowship. During the Opening Program in Chicago, the Fellows visited several incubators (mHub, 1871, and the Connectory), immersed themselves in workshops hosted by DePaul University, and engaged in extensive networking with local Chicago entrepreneurs.


After the culmination of the U.S-based portion of the program, 3 mentors from Chicago were selected to participate in the Reciprocal Exchange: Matthew Woods (Street Level/Urban Gateways), Sophia Padgett Perez (CPS Lives), and Samantha Schwartz (Workbox). After visiting their Fellows in Armenia, Georgia, and the Netherlands respectively, the mentors participated in the capstone YTILI Alumni Summit in Ljubljana, Slovenia.

With the support of the U.S. Embassy in Slovenia and CEED Slovenia, WorldChicago conducted the first ever YTILI Alumni Summit in September 2023. Over 100 YTILI Alumni from 43 different countries across all cohorts from 2016 – 2023 participated in the Summit, which was the first opportunity for alumni to connect across the larger network in person.








Highlights of the Summit included opening remarks from U.S. Ambassador Jamie L. Harpootlian and a presentation from David Henzel, the CEO of upcoach. Both European and American YTILI Alumni spent two full days networking, skill sharing, and discussing the goals and needs of the alumni network. The Summit received strong feedback from participants, many of whom reiterated what a special opportunity it was to be a part of a network of like-minded individuals, connecting across countries and continents.



# YOUNG LEADERS OF THE AMERICAS INITIATIVE

In May 2023, WorldChicago welcomed 15 fellows from 11 countries through the Young Leaders of the Americas Initiative (YLAI). YLAI was established by the Obama Administration in 2015 under the Y-initiatives, welcoming over 280 entrepreneurs from the Western Hemisphere – Canada, the Caribbean, and Latin America – to participate in a 4-week fellowship. In May 2023, the 15 fellows in Chicago came from Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Curaçao, Dominica, Guatemala, Jamaica, Mexico, Panama, and Peru.

These entrepreneurs represented business sectors of Education, Entrepreneurship, Arts & Culture, Agriculture & Animal Care, Disability Advocacy, Interpretation, Fashion, Health, and Community Development. While in Chicago, these leaders were partnered with organizations with similar focuses to learn about the approach Chicagoans take in their industries.

In addition to the partnerships, the fellows participated in Professional Fridays and a Solution Pitch Competition. During their Professional Fridays, the fellows attended professional development activities curated by the WorldChicago team, some of which prepared them for their Solution Pitch Competition. In their solution pitches, fellows identify a challenge their business faces and present their solution based on their experience in YLAI. One Chicago fellow, Gemma Eintou Moreau, was selected as a finalist.






WorldChicago youth programs provide hands-on workshops, skill training sessions, volunteer activities, and cultural events that inspire cross-cultural dialogue, build respect and mutual understanding, and boost civic engagement among Chicagoland teens and their international peers.

The leading youth program for WorldChicago is the Youth Diplomats Program, an eight-month experiential youth leadership program that engages Chicago-area high school students through hands-on learning opportunities. During their time together, students engage in cross-cultural conversations with international peers and attend lectures and workshops with global and Chicago-area academics, government officials, and community leaders.

This uniquely local program with a global mission includes an experiential learning visit to Washington D.C. to learn about government-facilitated public diplomacy and intercultural exchange.

Additionally, WorldChicago is a local coordinator for the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs' Youth Leadership Programs for international high school students and adult mentors. These short - yet dynamic - programs inspire crosscultural dialogue, build respect and mutual understanding, and boost civic engagement among young Americans and their international peers.


#### **FRANCE**

In partnership with Global Ties K.C., WorldChicago welcomed 13 students from France and French territories for a Youth Ambassadors program focused on community service in July 2023. Over the course of 2 weeks, the participants traveled to Washington, D.C. and Chicago. Participants met with organizations across Chicago that focused on youth development, civic engagement, and volunteering. At the program's end, participants implemented a service project in their home communities using the skills learned in the exchange.

#### LEGACY TECH GIRLS

In July of 2023, WorldChicago welcomed 20 of the next generation of women STEM leaders, aged 15 to 17, from East Asia and the Pacific. During their time in Chicago, the participants met community leaders in each of their STEM fields of interest - including medicine, entrepreneurship, robotics, and astronomy - for skill-building workshops, mentoring sessions, and opportunities for cultural immersion. The participants spent five days and four nights in pairs with their homestay families, building lasting relationships founded in Citizen Diplomacy.





#### **CENTRAL AMERICA**

In partnership with Georgetown CIED, WorldChicago hosted 20 participants from five Central American countries to provide hands-on experience in building skills of civic responsibility, community leadership, and cross-cultural understanding in the areas of environment and entrepreneurship. Over the course of nine days, participants experienced the unique environments and cultures of individual Chicago neighborhoods, meeting with local NGO leaders and community members. In doing this, they learned more about how local needs are communicated about and collaborated on to spur the correct targeted responses from organizational leadership. Highlights included volunteering with the Pilsen Food Pantry, peer-to-peer exchanges at Back of the Yards College Prep, and a workshop on circular economy and Sustainability at Plant Chicago.


#### **CANADA**

In August of 2023, WorldChicago hosted 15 teenage Youth Ambassadors from across Canada for 10 days to promote fostering relationships among youth from different ethnic, religious, and national groups. Additionally, the program worked to promote mutual understanding, respect, and collaboration between the United States and Canada, with a special focus on promoting the inclusivity of indigenous community members. Participants visited nonprofits and organizations across the city to learn how local leaders established missions in bringing members of their community together in meaningful ways.

## YOUTH DIPLOMATS

Each year, WorldChicago selects an average cohort of 35 students from Chicago and the Chicagoland area for an 8-month experiential learning program focused on citizen diplomacy, international affairs, and developing leadership skills. From January to August, the Youth Diplomats met with the Turkish Consulate in Chicago; engaged with fellows from Latin America and the Carribean through the Young Leaders of the Americas Initiative (YLAI); learned about careers in international affairs; and engaged with students from Canada, France, Central America, and Southeast Asia. During this program, 10 students are selected to travel to the nation's capital to learn about foreign affairs through the Department of State, foreign embassies, state representatives, and nonprofits.
